There were over 200 MKs at Ukarumpa International School as well as children of Papua New Guinean staff. We went for two years but stayed for twenty, raising our own four kids there and loving the opportunity to be a part of the Bible translation task in PNG.




I'm on my way - *Talitha Follent*

How could a teacher help with Bible translation?






